Is planet mars (Mangal) the pivotal catalyst facilitating the transition of a medical doctor into a surgeon? An extensive scrutiny of diverse cosmic indicators and astrological chart signatures (Part 2)

Abstract

This research paper delves into the astrological determinants that may elucidate an individual's aptitude for embarking upon a career as a medical surgeon, firmly anchored in the foundational tenets of Brihat Parasara Hora Shastra. By articulating an innovative framework for discerning the critical astrological influences indispensable for achieving success in this vocation, the study rigorously examines the intricate interrelations between salient planetary placements, with particular emphasis on the preeminent influence of Mars, and the complex dynamics of house interactions within the natal chart.

It expounds upon the relationship of Mars with the sixth, eighth, and twelfth houses, delineating how these associations shape the characteristics and opportunities conducive to a medical career. Furthermore, this research aspires to illustrate how insights pertaining to Mars can yield profound evaluations of an individual's suitability for the role of a medical surgeon, thereby enriching the scholarly discourse on the intricate interplay between astrological factors and professional aspirations within this specialised domain.

Introduction

Dr. Nitin ^[1] endeavoured to ascertain whether a natal chart possesses the qualities necessary for an individual to become a medical surgeon, focusing on astrological factors. While his research offered valuable insights, there remains an opportunity for further exploration through additional evidence and diverse data sets to bolster his findings.

Pt. Punarvasu ^[2] articulated the key astrological factors pertinent to a career in medicine, emphasising the significance of the Moon sign over the ascendant. While his insights are noteworthy, there is an opportunity for further exploration in providing detailed specifics regarding the astrological signifiers that differentiate a doctor from a surgeon.

Bodhi ^[3] outlined various planetary combinations that should be present in a horoscope to signify success in the medical profession. He also aimed to identify specific planets as signifiers for different specialisations. While his work provides a valuable starting point, there is an opportunity for enhancement, as it could benefit from additional data and a more comprehensive thesis to further support these assertions.

Dr. Shantha ^[4] employed multiple divisional charts to elucidate astrological indicators, concentrating on the influence of specific planets and their energies in shaping outcomes.

Pawan Kumar ^[5] endeavoured to interpret the astrological signs and houses associated with a successful medical career, concentrating on a specific combination of planetary influences.

Acharya Mragank ^[6] examined the houses in a kundali that contribute to the attainment of a successful medical profession. Furthermore, he discussed specific yogas within the kundali to provide deeper insights into this field.

Margareta ^[7] discussed the role of astrology in surgery, providing an in-depth analysis of the significance of various houses and their corresponding influences.

Sachin Malhotra ^[8] referenced an array of texts and highlighted numerous shlokas and sutras that facilitate the exploration of astrological yogas pertinent to a career in the medical profession.

Raghavendra Sai Akkinapragada ^[9] has elucidated how astrology can predict a career in medicine. He presented a comprehensive dataset showing that connections between the ascendant, fifth, or ninth lord and the sixth, eighth, or twelfth houses, or their respective lords, can indicate that an individual may pursue a career as a medical doctor.

This research paper investigates how astrological probes can reveal an individual's competence to embark on a career as a surgical doctor. By analysing planetary alignments and house relationships within the birth chart, it illuminates the pivotal astrological components that significantly influence a career in surgery. The study emphasises the influential planets that shape characteristics and opportunities within the medical field, offering novel insights into the relationship between astrological factors and an individual's potential for a surgical career.

Methods and Materials

Raghavendra Sai Akkinapragada ^[9] established that if the ascendant, fifth, or ninth lord is connected to the sixth, eighth, or twelfth houses or their respective lords, it can be inferred that the individual is likely to pursue a career as a medical doctor. Building on this, we now need to determine whether an individual identified as a potential doctor is bestowed with favourable astrological planetary alignments that would support a career as a surgeon.

To grasp the characteristics of each planet, one should consult Chapter 3 ("Planetary Characters and Description") of Brihat Parasara Hora Shastra ^[10], Slokas 12 and 13 are provided on page 28 (see Figure-1).

As per slokas in Figure-1, "Planetary Governances: The Sun is the soul of all. The Moon is the mind. Mars is one's strength. Mercury is speech giver, while Jupiter confers knowledge and happiness. Venus governs semen (potency) while Saturn governs grief".

To grasp the Dhatu, Moola and Jeeva divisions of each planet, one should consult Chapter 3 ("Planetary Characters and Description") of Brihat Parasara Hora Shastra ^[10], Sloka 47 is provided on page 28 (see Figure-2).

As per slokas in Figure-2, "Dhatu, Moola and Jeeva Divisions: Dhatu planets are Rahu, Mars and Saturn and Moon, while the Sun and Venus are Moola planets. Mercury, Jupiter, and Ketu rule Jeevas".

To comprehend the sixth house in the natal chart, one must refer to Chapter 11 ("Judgement of Houses") of Brihat Parasara Hora Shastra ^[10], specifically Sloka 7 found on page 122 (see Figure-3).

As per slokas in Figure-3, "Sixth house: Doubts about death, enemies, ulcers, etc".

To comprehend the eighth house in the natal chart, one must refer to Chapter 11 ("Judgement of Houses") of Brihat Parasara Hora Shastra ^[10], specifically Sloka 9 found on page 122 (see Figure-4).

As per sloka in Figure-4, "Eighth house: indicates longevity, battle, enemies, sudden events etc".

To comprehend the twelfth house in the natal chart, one must refer to Chapter 11 ("Judgement of Houses") of Brihat Parasara Hora Shastra ^[10], specifically Sloka 13 found on page 123 (see Figure-5).

As per sloka in Figure-5, "Twelfth house: indicates expenses, history of enemies, death etc".

To understand the significance of Moon to be considered equivalent to the ascendant, one must refer to Chapter 12 ("Effects of the First House") of Brihat Parasara Hora Shastra ^[10], specifically Sloka 11 found on page 129 (see Figure-6).

As per sloka in Figure-6, "The learned in Astrology should base the effects on the Moon also as applicable to the ascendant".

To understand the planetary aspects, one must refer to Chapter 26 ("Evaluation of Planetary Aspects") of Brihat Parasara Hora Sastra ^[10], specifically Slokas 3-5 found on page 254 (see Figure-7), the following are given.

As per slokas in Figure-7, “All planets aspect 7th house fully, Saturn has 3rd and 10th aspects, Jupiter has 5th and 9th aspects, Mars has 4th and 8th aspects respectively”.

From Figure 1, one can identify the unique characteristics attributed to the various planets. Figure 2 clarifies that the sixth house and its ruling planet represent health issues and ailments. Additionally, Figure 3 indicates that the eighth house and its lord are closely linked to longevity and

unexpected events. Figure 4 clarifies that the twelfth house and its ruling planet relate to death and its financial implications. Moreover, Figure 5 underscores the importance of the Moon, which should be considered on par with the ascendant. Figure 6 categorises the divisions of the planets, while Figure 7 outlines the distinct qualities of each planet, with a particular focus on the individual traits of Saturn, Jupiter, and Mars.

According to Table 1, Akkinapragada ^[9] has formulated a framework for predicting an individual’s career trajectory as a medical doctor. This framework stipulates that if at least one

of the six applicable rules, detailed in Table 2 below, is met, it may indicate the potential career path of the individual.

Table 2: Framework for Predicting an Individual's Potential to Become a Medical Doctor^[9]

Index	Rule Name	Rule Description
1	Doctor Rule-1	The ascendant lord in the natal chart must establish a link with the sixth, eighth, and twelfth houses, their respective lords, or with their corresponding nakshatras.
2	Doctor Rule-2	The fifth lord in the natal chart must forge a connection with the sixth, eighth, and twelfth houses, their respective lords, or with their corresponding nakshatras.
3	Doctor Rule-3	The ninth lord in the natal chart must establish a connection with the sixth, eighth, and twelfth houses, their respective lords, or with their corresponding nakshatras.
4	Doctor Rule-4	Should the aforementioned three rules (rule 1-3) prove inapplicable, the Moon's house should be regarded as the ascendant, necessitating a connection with the sixth, eighth, and twelfth, their respective lords, or with their corresponding nakshatras.
5	Doctor Rule-5	The fifth lord derived from the Moon (as opposed to the ascendant) in the natal chart must create a connection with the corresponding sixth, eighth, and twelfth houses, their respective lords, or with their corresponding nakshatras.
6	Doctor Rule-6	The ninth lord derived from the Moon (rather than the ascendant) in the natal chart must establish a connection with the corresponding sixth, eighth, and twelfth houses, their respective lords, or with their corresponding nakshatras.

We now intend to establish a new framework to predict the likelihood of a medical doctor transitioning into a surgeon, drawing upon Figures 1 to 7 and Tables 1 to 2. This framework places particular emphasis on planet Mars (Mangal) as a crucial element in a medical doctor's journey towards becoming a surgeon. Mars represents dhatu (the metals and instruments used in surgery) and embodies qualities such as vitality, energy, courage, and perseverance, as well as enthusiasm, ambition, assertiveness, and

determination. These traits, along with characteristics of leadership and confidence, position Mars as the foremost indicator of success within the surgical field. This framework aims to assess whether a specific medical doctor has the potential to shift into a surgical role, as detailed in Table 3 below. Should at least one criterion from this set of seven be validated in the natal chart of a medical doctor, it can be inferred that there exists a significantly high probability of that individual pursuing a career in surgery.

Table 3: Framework for Predicting the Potential of a Specific Medical Doctor to Transition into a Surgeon

Index	Rule Name	Rule Description
1	Surgeon Rule-1	Planet Mars must be associated with one of the sixth, eighth, or twelfth houses derived from the ascendant.
2	Surgeon Rule-2	Planet Mars must be connected to one of the sixth, eighth, or twelfth house lords based on the ascendant.
3	Surgeon Rule-3	Planet Mars must be linked to the corresponding nakshatras of either the sixth, eighth, or twelfth lords derived from the ascendant.
4	Surgeon Rule-4	Planet Mars must be connected to one of the sixth, eighth, or twelfth houses as derived from the Moon.
5	Surgeon Rule-5	Planet Mars must be associated with one of the sixth, eighth, or twelfth house lords based on the Moon.
6	Surgeon Rule-6	Planet Mars must be linked to the corresponding nakshatras of either the sixth, eighth, or twelfth lords derived from the Moon.
7	Surgeon Rule-7	The eighth lord, whether determined from the ascendant or the Moon, must occupy a favourable position, indicating that the eighth lord should either be exalted or located in its own house.

Results and Discussion

Based on the framework presented in Table-3, which assists in predicting whether a medical doctor has the potential to

become a surgeon, the dataset outlined in Table-1 has been meticulously analysed for each individual doctor. The results of these predictions are provided below in Table-4.

Furthermore, the case of one pathologist (Item 43), who displayed strong astrological indicators for a surgical career but chose a different professional path, reinforces the adaptability of individual choice amidst favourable conditions. Another doctor (Item 46), whose chart did not meet any of the criteria, appropriately aligns with their career as a physician rather than a surgeon, further fortifying the robustness and dependability of the predictive rule set.

Conclusion

In conclusion, this research offers a comprehensive exploration into the pivotal role of Mars (Mangal) in facilitating the transition of medical doctors into successful surgical careers. By meticulously scrutinising diverse cosmic indicators and astrological chart signatures, the study underscores Mars as a key astrological influence that embodies essential qualities such as courage, vitality, and precision, which are indispensable in the realm of surgery. The framework presented herein provides a robust predictive model, revealing a deep connection between planetary alignments and vocational outcomes in the medical field, particularly in surgery. This research not only enriches the existing discourse on astrological influences in career

progression but also lays a solid foundation for future inquiries into how specific planetary combinations might influence specialisations within surgery and other medical disciplines. The findings affirm the relevance of astrology in understanding professional success and open up avenues for further astrological research with a focus on precision-based vocations like surgery.
